Record of Physical Examination "The Physical"

- •Opportunity to establish a relationship with a healthcare provider who can advocate and support your child's health;
- Medical needs can be assessed;
- Connect families with community resources

Dental Report

"More than **50 million hours** are lost annually because of oral health problems which affect children's performance at school and success in later life." (Kwan, et al., 2005, p.677)

Oral disease can lead to

- pain,
- tooth loss,
- what foods your child can eat, and
- poor self image

The blood-lead certificate



"Early childhood lead exposure can lead to a wide range of problems in children...(including) cognitive impairment and behavioral problems" (Zhang, et al., 2013, p. e72)

In 2016, the CDC found that 500,000 children ages 1-5 tested at or above the reference level of 5 μ g/dl.


Signs & Symptoms of lead poisoning

- Developmental delay
- Learning difficulties
- Irritability
- Loss of appetite
- Weight loss
- Sluggishness and fatigue
- PICA (eating things that aren't food like paint chips, dirt)
- Abdominal pain
- Vomiting
- Constipation
- Hearing loss
- Seizures
